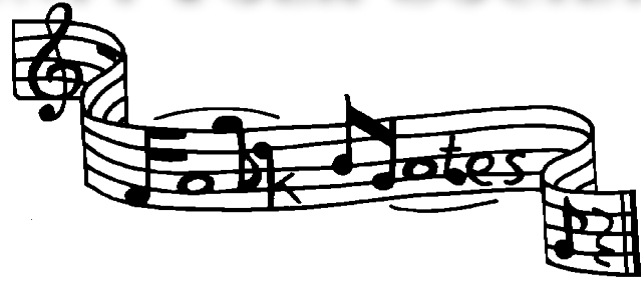
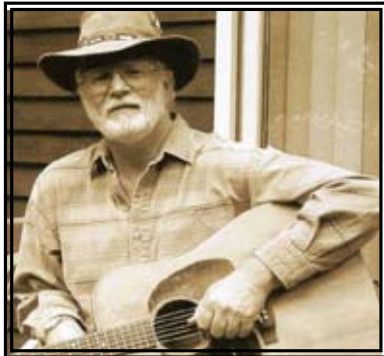

The Unlikely Duo

Who are they?



Carey Dubbert, a long-time Occidental resident and national champion in both hammered dulcimer and the autoharp, will perform Oct 16th from 4 pm to 6 pm. Carey's repertoire spans many genres, from classical to Celtic to gospel and old time. The program will include solo pieces on the hammered dulcimer and on the autoharp along with delightful duets with Brendan Buss as The Unlikely Duo, and a couple of tunes with Ron Bean and Ann McChesney-Young from the Bay Area.

Carey's background extends back many generations, from his maternal grandmother who played organ in the choir and his paternal grandmother who taught piano, to his father who played the marimba in Chautauqua in the late 1920s, and percussion in the Rochester Symphony. Carey studied piano, then percussion, attended Manhattan School of Music playing bassoon, and has been playing hammered dulcimer and autoharp for more than 35 years.

Brendan is a local saxophonist who also heralds from Occidental. He can be heard with many Sonoma County acts including Piezo Electric Effect, a 7 piece funk outfit, and The Pat Jordan Band, a Santa Rosa favorite whose music pulls inspiration from Dave Mathews and Britney Spears. Brendan studied at SSU with the late Mel Graves and at S.R.J.C. with Bennett Friedman.

When a relative new comer to the hammered dulcimer, Carey won the championship at Winfield with his unique style. Over the years he has perfected this style so well suited to the lyrical playing for which he is known. As for the autoharp, if you have only heard your 3rd grade teacher strum it to accompany Old MacDonald, you are in for a treat. The autoharp is capable of clear melody with full, rich harmony, and Carey is one of the foremost autoharp players in the world. He is a regular performer and workshop leader at the California Autoharp Gathering as well as performing and leading workshops at the Mountain Laurel Autoharp Gathering and the Willamette Valley Autoharp Gathering, the Sonoma County Folk Festival, and he has performed on the main stage at the Wells Fargo Center. Carey also plays monthly for the Alzheimer's Respite Center. He has performed many times with Bryan Bowers who says of Carey's playing - "stunning".

SCFS Supports Local Public Television!

Sonoma County's own public television broadcasting station KRCB is struggling financially, partially due to removal of federal funding (to all PBS stations). SoCoFoSo has been brainstorming on how they might help out. We decided we didn't want to just write a check, but that we could continue our "in kind" relationship with KRCB, whereby we support each other's events and needs with written and spoken publicity.

When we heard that KRCB TV had scheduled a locally staffed pledge night, the Board of Directors immediately volunteered to get involved. On the evening of Saturday, August 6, 2011, four of our five board members staffed the phone bank, along with folk society members Jim Kaumeyer, Colleen Arroyo, Mary DeLap, Ellindale Wells, and Steve and Cindy Hogle. SoCoFoSo President Steve DeLap co-hosted the live program, along with Robin Pressman, his KRCB Radio co-host of Saturday's "Our Roots are Showing" program. All of us had a great time, as a live feed to the studio was toggled with segments of two wonderful NEW documentaries: "Peter, Paul and Mary: Carry It On: A Musical Legacy" and "Legends of Folk: The Village Scene".

We've heard that callers pledged their dollars in record amounts that evening, maybe partially inspired by having local people working in the studio. Remember when this was always the pledge night format? The expanded geographic area that the station now reaches was helpful, as well, attested by generous pledges received from such places as Alamo, Castro Valley and Boulder Creek! Several callers told us that they support all of the region's public television and radio stations, knowing that individual member support is needed to continue offering programs that are so different from the usual network fare.

If the folk society is called upon again to help out KRCB, we will be ready! All of us need to support public broadcasting, in whatever method or financial amount we can manage. Producing quality programs requires community involvement and support.

Pick'n Potluck Favorite Recipes

Savory Zucchini Garbanzos

2 medium onions, sliced

3 TB olive oil

1 pound zucchini, sliced (about 3-4 medium zucchini)

1½ cups cooked garbanzos (1 15 oz can, drained)

½ tsp dried oregano

¼ tsp dried basil

1 tsp garlic powder

3 medium tomatoes, chopped or 1 cup stewed tomatoes

salt to taste

Sauté onions for a few minutes in olive oil. Add garbanzo beans, seasonings, and tomatoes. Simmer covered for 10 minutes. Add zucchini and cook just until slightly tender.

Makes 6 servings.
