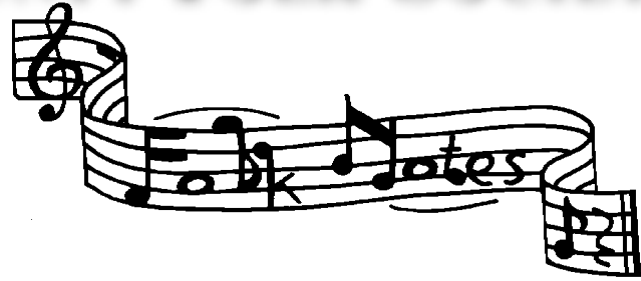

My Encounter with the Folk Police

It was 1975 and I was in Washington DC, visiting my in-laws. Reading the paper, I noticed that the Smithsonian Institute was producing the first Festival of American Folklife, to be held on the National Mall, next to the Washington Monument. I read that there was a delegation of California folk musicians, including Kenny Hall and several others that I knew, so I just had to make it down there to see all my friends.

It was the Fourth of July weekend, and Washington was mobbed with tourists. After the Festival concerts, a big fireworks display was planned, so it wasn't easy getting to the Festival site. But once there, I ran into Western Swing guitar legend Frank Hicks, jamming with Kenny Hall and about a dozen other fiddlers and old time musicians I knew from Northern and Central California. I grabbed my fiddle and joined in the jam.

It was an absolutely beautiful day in the Nation's Capital. But then something very unexpected happened. At the height of the jam, a Festival official came over and told the California delegation to head for the stage and do a show. I just followed the crowd, ready to continue the jam in front of an audience. But it wasn't that simple.

The Festival official was Bess Lomax Hawes, daughter of the famed musicologist Alan Lomax. She was the Festival Music Director, and, I later learned, had flown the California delegation directly to Washington to participate in this Festival. She looked at me with great suspicion as I tried to get on the stage, and then she stopped me for a very uncomfortable interrogation.

She needed to know who I was, what I was doing there, why I knew these fiddlers, and why I didn't have a badge. I thought of the classic Bogart response ("I don't have to show you no stinkin' badge") but I thought better of it. Ms. Hawes was not in the mood. So I tried to explain that I was a fiddler in California and had won top honors that year in the California State Old Time Fiddling Championship. I knew all these folks from contests and get togethers around the state; these were all friends of mine. She asked if I had grown up with this style of music (which I had not), and where I had grown up and what kind of work I did. Explaining that I was a school teacher in San Francisco and had grown up in Detroit, studying classical violin — none of this helped.

Bess Lomax Hawes selected groups for this Festival on the basis of their relationship to a living folk culture. These California fiddlers seemed to be a perfect example of that. I was not. Even though I had discovered fiddling in California, not Detroit, and won fiddle contests and played music with these people, Bess Hawes was not impressed.


Kenny and Frank were already on stage and had come over to the stairs to ask when I was coming up. Frank shouted out to me, "Come on up here, we need you." But Ms. Hawes was not going to allow it. I was being detained by the Folk Police.

The band started up without me. As a consolation, Ms. Hawes invited me to return the next day when there would be an "open" fiddle contest I could enter. Which I did, backed up by Frank Hicks, and urged on by Kenny Hall. I won second place. I looked for Bess Lomax Hawes, but she wasn't there. I never saw her again.

I thought about my "arrest" by the Folk Police all the way back to California, driving through America's proverbial "heartland." I grew up in that heartland. The Motor City was as much a part of it as rural California. It didn't make sense. But I forgot about it, went to a few more festivals, and finally returned to San Francisco, where a check from the Smithsonian Institute was waiting in the mail.

Pick'n Pot Luck recipe

SOUTHERN CREAM APPLE PIE

- 1 unbaked 9-inch pie shell
- 1-1/4 cups of sugar
- 1/2 cup of flour
- 1 cup of dairy sour cream
- 1 egg beaten
- 1/2 tsp. of vanilla
- 1/4 tsp. of salt
- 2 cups of finely chopped tart apples (gravensteins are the best!)
- 1 tsp. of cinnamon
- 1/4 cup of butter or margarine



Directions:

1. Bake the pie shell at 350 degrees for 7 minutes. Set aside and let cool.
2. Combine 3/4 cup sugar and 2 tablespoons of flour.
3. Add the sour cream, vanilla, egg and salt and beat until smooth.
4. Stir in chopped apple and turn the mixture into the partially-baked pie shell
5. Bake at 450 degrees for 3 minutes, or until it is almost set.
6. Blend in the remaining 1/2 cup of sugar, the remaining 6 tablespoons of flour, the cinnamon, and butter until the mixture is crumbly.
7. Sprinkle over the pie and bake for 10 more minutes.

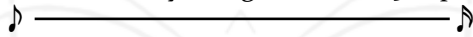

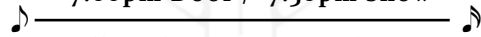
