

We're looking forward to continuing with that again in the future.

A big thanks to those who supported this festival through program ads and sponsorships as well. The Folk Society has taken on another project during the last three months. We were fortunate enough to be chosen by a group of students in a Santa Rosa Junior College Web design class to have our Website worked over, updated and remade to our expectations (kind of an "Extreme Makeover, Web Edition"). This class takes on website design for local non-profits with the intent of preparing the students for dealing with "real-world" clients. Our student group should be ready for anything after dealing with a cranky bunch of old folkies. So many thanks go to Nichelle, Rebecca, Amy and Ana for hanging in with us and designing a gorgeous website with picture galleries, archives, calendars, tune players and video links. ### SoCoFoSo Volunteer Opportunities!




