Labor Day Strawberry Music Festival Cancelled!

"Strawberry Music Festivals" happen twice a year, always on Memorial Day and Labor Day weekends. The location is Camp Mather, which borders Yosemite National Park, in the Sierras. The uncontrolled "Rim Fire" is the cause of the cancellation of this event that has become an annual musical pilgrimage to Strawberry for many folks in our area.

Here is the official word from Tuolumne County Community Resources Agency and the Board of Supervisors, County of Tuolumne, announced on August 22nd:

"Due to the ongoing State of Emergency and the potential adverse effects of the wildfire on public health, safety and welfare, the County of Tuolumne cannot allow the Strawberry Music Festival to occur at the site as originally permitted on the dates of August 29 through September 2, 2013."

By the time you receive this newsletter, we sure hope that the fire has run its course and spared communities now in the path of the flames.

Joining the Chorus

It seems there has always been interest in group singing, joining voices in a well known melody and set of words. For eons, group singing has manifested in various structured choirs and choruses. Most churches have a choir. There's four-part harmony barbershop singing; for women, Sweet Adelines. For men, SPEBSQSA (the Society for the Preservation & Encouragement of Barbershop Quartet Singing in America) and the Barbershop Harmony Society. A quick look at the Internet reveals hundreds of opportunities for structured singing, for many folks a valuable, educational and communal experience.

Fortunately, there is also that unstructured, open voice, open heart kind of singing encouraged in casual get-togethers that spring up at parties and gatherings. One example of an ongoing informal opportunity for music making is the local Singers Circle. This has been going on, by some accounts, since the early 1970's started by Kate Wolf and friends. (Kate and good friends John Brandenburg and Hugh Shacklett also had a folk music show on KSRO called The Singers Circle in those early days.)

The present day Sonoma County Singers Circle happens once a month at various people's houses, usually on the last Friday evening of the month. Attendees are alerted to the time and location by an email list, at present administered by Dennis Drury (drury@sonic.net). Many of the songs sung are found in the songbook Rise Up Singing from Sing Out! Publications, a 1200 song compendium of mainly folk songs.

The "Love Choir" gives Sonoma County folks another opportunity to sing whole heartedly and with great gusto. Practices with this group happen every Wednesday evening at Subud Hall, 234 Hutchins St in Sebastopol. The Love Choir often sings at local events such as Sebastopol's Apple Blossom Fair in the spring and The Gravenstein Apple Fair in the fall. They can also be found at The Kate Wolf Festival in Laytonville at the end of June as well as popping up sporadically at the Sebastopol Community Cultural Center at First Friday Events. Jim (Mr. Music) Corbett is the ringleader of this wonderful conglomeration and he readily acknowledges that "everybody is already in the Love Choir."

Farther afield, there are a number of groups, singing jams really, in the Bay Area. Many of them were started and continue under the auspices of an informal collective called "In Harmony's Way". There are some regular sessions as well as more spontaneous sings often happening in the East Bay as well as in San Francisco. The

nearest group, run by marvelous singer and song writer, Margaret Miles, is on the third Sunday of the month in San Rafael. These groups are often focused on unaccompanied singing, and participants tend not to use written music as there is a feeling that thumbing through a book or a bunch of papers distracts one from the singer of the moment. The "In Harmony's Way" Facebook page <https://www.facebook.com/groups/InHarmonysWay/> seems to be their primary communications device for times and locations of their sings.

There is a book, published this summer and as yet unread by me (I just love the reviews) called Imperfect Harmony: Finding Happiness Singing with Others by Stacy Horn. It details the benefits of singing and of singing in groups. Check this Time magazine review: <http://ideas.time.com/2013/08/16/singing-changes-your-brain/>.

Singing is probably one of the most gratifying things we humans can do. It can be scary and it can be exhilarating...and it can be just plain fun. We've noted some local opportunities, and there are more to come, so just sing!

Pick'n Pot Luck recipe

Southern Style Cornbread Casserole

Ingredients:

- 1 Box "Jiffy" Cornbread Mix
- 1/3 cup all purpose flour
- 1/2 tsp Baking soda
- Salt, Pepper (to taste)
- Pinch of sugar
- 1 8 oz Can Creamed Style Corn
- 8 oz Fresh corn cut off the cob
- 1/2 Cup Sour Cream
- 1/2 Cup Buttermilk
- 1 stick salted butter melted
- Cheddar Cheese (optional)
- Canned Jalapenos (optional)



Cooking Instructions:

- Preheat oven to 350 degrees F
- Combine wet ingredients
- Combine dry ingredients
- Mix all ingredients together and pour into a lightly greased 8X12 casserole dish
- Cook for 35-40 minutes
- Remove after 30 minutes and put cheddar and jalapenos on top and bake for duration if desired.

Faith Ako presents **KULAIWI** New Album Release

Faith Thompson Ako, a longtime resident of Northern California, has been performing and preserving Hawaiian Music over the last decade. She has brought her deep soul tones and island blends to appreciative audiences not only throughout Sonoma County, but the greater Bay Area, Southern California and her home state of Hawai'i. Her first breakthrough album, Kukahi, earned her two Hawai'i Music Awards.

Her second album, Papaku, garnered further accolades as it earned a Grammy entry in the Hawaiian genre category in 2010. Faith has most recently entertained audiences in popular venues such as The de Young Fine Arts Museum, Yoshi's in Oakland and San Francisco, Yoshi's Jazz Festival on the Fillmore in San Francisco, Freight and Salvage Coffee House in Berkeley, Wells Fargo Center for the Arts in Santa Rosa and the Dougherty Performing Arts Center in San Ramon, California.

Devout fans have also embraced her locally at Aloha Festivals, and music in more intimate settings such as Don Quixote and Pono Hawaiian Grill in Santa Cruz, Roy's Hawaiian Fusion Cuisine in San Francisco, Napa Valley Opera House, and ukulele workshops along with various fundraisers.

Kulaiwi, My Beloved Homeland, the title of her much anticipated album release, is the latest fulfillment of her musical journey. This music reflects the breadth of Faith's rich cultural heritage. Including songs derived from Samoa, Tahiti, and Hawai'i, Faith also shares three original compositions on her newest album: compilations of some of the great artists she has worked with in the Hula world, along with a He Mele Inoa in tribute to Kumu Hula Shawna Alapa'i and Haumana of Halau Na Pua O Ka Laake'a. All of the songs represent Faith's deep connection to the spirit of Aloha and love for the islands where she was raised. Iwi, meaning bones in Hawaiian, embodies Faith's Samoan roots and rich Hawaiian influence which are her inspiration for this album.
