

I started my interest in playing music with the ukulele. I had a bohemian uncle who lived in the City and broke out his uke whenever we visited there. I've recently wanted to begin playing again and thought this column would be a good place to spread and gather local uke gossip.

Young players are pushing the definition of uke technique and creating a renewed interest in the instrument. Most local music stores are stocking ukuleles and clubs are forming around the Bay Area. The most active of the clubs is the Ukulele Club of Santa Cruz, meeting every third Thursday of the month in Santa Cruz. A bit of a drive, but worth it if you're in the area. There are also uke sightings at the Moose Hall in Petaluma, along with open mic opportunities.

I'm hoping to continue my investigation and relay my findings on to you.

This past winter he was nominated for a 2008 Grammy Award for best country instrumental performance for the song "Little Monk" off his most recent release "When At Last." Barenberg has also played on the soundtracks for several Ken Burns films, including "The Civil War," "The Brooklyn Bridge," "The Shakers," and "Huey Long."

Bryan Sutton is one of the most high-profile acoustic guitarists in bluegrass and country music these days, a first-call Nashville session player whose jaw-dropping technique, deep background in tradition, and fluency in multiple styles have landed him important gigs with Ricky Skaggs, Jerry Douglas, Earl Scruggs, the Dixie Chicks and Béla Fleck.
